



## 2022 NATIONAL TEAM TRY-OUTS

January 15, 2021

Dear Provincial Coordinators,

Once again, we are inviting each member organization to send up to three students (chosen by whatever method you decide on) to attend the tryout tournament for selection to the 2021-22 national team. At the tryouts, the Canadian World Schools Committee will select up to 9 delegates to attend a week-long summer training camp that will begin the final team selection and training for the 2022 Worlds to be tentatively hosted by Macau in the summer of 2022.

In addition to the three official provincial applicants, other students from your province may apply independently for one of the very limited alternate application places at the tryouts. This year, we will be hosting an online tournament for the alternate applicants (information attached). The alternate applications are for the few exceptional applicants who for some reason were not selected for as one of the 3 official delegates. Please distribute the application forms to your coaches for them to share with any student they feel should be considered. These alternate applications must be submitted by March 5<sup>th</sup>; students invited to participate in the online alternate application tournament will be notified by March 12<sup>th</sup> and must be available for the **online tournament on March 27-28<sup>th</sup>**, 2021. It is not certain at this point how many places will be available for those applying through the alternate application process, but the number will be quite small.

The **national team selection tournament is scheduled for the weekend of May 22-24<sup>th</sup>, 2021** and will consist of an introductory seminar and eight rounds of World Style debating, one of them being prepared. Students will be given the prepared resolution by April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021. All debaters will also have an interview with a member of the World's committee or someone designated by them. Debaters' selection will be based on a combination of their debating performance, their capacity for improvement, an interview with one of the judges, and their formal application. We will do our best to contact all students as soon as possible after the tournament to let them know the results.

The cost for participating in both the alternate application selection tournament and the National Tryouts will be \$10/debater.

We will make the final selection of the World Schools Team (a team of 5 and 2 reserves) after the training camp that will take place in the summer of 2021, location to be announced. All of those at the training camp will be invited to participate in the international events that Team Canada may take part in.

The debaters selected for the summer camp must commit themselves in writing to a number of requirements including a code of conduct. Students selected for the World Schools Championships must commit to attending preparation sessions the week immediately prior to the World Schools tournament. The coach may try to get the team



together at other points during the year, but attendance at those events is not mandatory. In addition, the coach will give the team regular assignments designed to broaden their knowledge and to keep them on top of current issues, and the selected debaters are expected to do these.

In order to be eligible for the team, students must be in a high school in Canada for the 2021-22 school year (in Quebec, students who will be in their first year at a CEGEP in 2021-22 are also eligible), and they must have reached their 14th birthday but not their 19th birthday by the first day of the 2022 World Schools Championships. Students must debate for the country in which they go to school. Students do not have to be Canadian citizens in order to debate for Canada.

The World Schools Debating Championships (WSDC) has an excellent website at [www.schoolsdebate.com](http://www.schoolsdebate.com). We would ask that all participants in the selection tournament go to this site and download the **Notes for Adjudicators** found in the Rules & Guides section. These notes give a very detailed explanation of Worlds style debating and in particular, the special responsibilities of each member of the team.

We would recommend that participants read this document thoroughly and bring it with them to the tryouts as we will be referring to it frequently during the briefing. Students might also read through the section on Definition Guidelines.

**Please email the names of your 3 provincial delegates as soon as possible and no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. The students are then expected to submit their completed application form by April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The alternate applicant candidates are asked to submit their applications by March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021 in order to be invited to attend the online tournament.**
